AIChE Boston Local Section – Career Development Workshop Series Sharpening Softer Skills

Tackling technical challenges may be no problem for many engineers, but when it comes to soft skills, such as the art of negotiation or creative thinking, that's another story. To better serve its members, the Boston local section recently launched a career development program that specifically addresses these soft skills.

"The Boston section has held professional development workshops before, such as the informative pumping and mixing seminars run by Dave Eckhart, but this year is the first time we've focused on the 'people skills' needed for career advancement," explains Rob Reintjes, past section chair and current board of directors candidate. "In addition to expanding our services to members, a number of people who had not previously attended monthly meetings became active members," he continues. One attendee raved, "The Career Search workshop was definitely worth coming to, even from Providence, RI, a one-hour drive. I especially enjoyed the exercises, as I need to practice the probing/networking related conversation skills...I'm interested in knowing more about the [local section] monthly meetings you [Rob] mentioned."

The series of 10 workshops (Box) were coordinated by Marian Mailloux, president of Connected Visions, in conjunction with the Career and Professional Services (CAPS) committee run by Kannan Vembu, section vice chair. CAPS was founded last year by James Cross, current section chair. Cross stated that "the CAPS committee objectives are to facilitate matching employers with job-seekers for mutual benefit, and to emphasize the importance of continual professional development. This series was the first step toward realizing those goals."

"We were interested in providing workshops that addressed a wide range

of relevant topics", says Mailloux. "It is important to assist the students, who are getting ready to enter the job market, as well as professionals looking to sharpen skills to keep current in a highly competitive environment."

"As an employer, I found great value for my employees and for myself in attending the career workshops together and then applying the learning in our daily operations. Mailloux has brought an added dimension to the local section with those 'soft' aspects that are the hardest to master, such as delegation, communication and working together more effectively." Reintjes adds: "Thanks to Carlton, Partha and Robin, who provided their programs at no cost to the section, and Cabot Corp., TIAX and the Tufts University Chemical Engineering Dept., which provided free meeting space, we were able to generate \$1,800 in profits. These revenues were used to help cover the costs of the AIChE New England Student Regional Conference this year."
