In the future, look in your email inbox for requests to help student chapters in your area, or student chapters you can have a virtual connection with, so that they can participate in all the activities.

This year the Fellows were looking to support a competition that encourages students to present a design, or design improvement, that solves a problem that an organization is funding and studying. We are looking for ways for students, in universities with lower than average resources, to have a way to showcase their talent and problem solving to a wider audience.

This year, the Student Design Problem is a plastic processing problem. Along with it, students have a possibility of proposing improvements to the recycling centers that supply the raw materials - a circular economy problem. The Circular Economy Problem has its own prizes, in addition to the Student Design Problem prizes. (Cont'd on Page 3)

These prizes are funded by the Alliance to End Plastic Waste. We hope to see growth in participation in the Student Design Problem and the Circular Economy Problem. This is part of AIChE's effort to provide a forum for solutions to the global plastic waste problem. We owe many, many thanks to Greg Yeo, who worked long and hard to produce the final problem set that was released to universities at the start of the school year.

Consider mentioning the Student Design Problem, or the Circular Economy problem, to Professors at the Chapter you interact with. There will be a on-line forum to have questions answered about anything in the problem statement, including the data and drawings.

The Student Design and or Circular Economy problem can be worked on in Senior Design Class, even if the student chooses not to submit to the competition. Some universities require students to propose a problem, rather than receiving one from the professor.

We will be looking to support a Student Design Problem and a Societal (e.g. Circular Economy, Climate Change, Renewable Energy, Sustainability) Problem related to it next year, with a different organization. We will be looking for a new volunteer Fellow to lead this activity.

I look forward to seeing many of you in person in Phoenix. I want to hear joys and concerns about your personal student chapter interactions, or how we can connect you to a student chapter soon.
