ne of the Doing a World of Good campaign's most far-reaching and life-changing programs was unveiled at the 2020 AlChE Virtual Gala. The Future of STEM Scholars Initiative (FOSSI) is the first industrywide equity, diversity, and inclusion initiative aimed at creating pathways for more underrepresented groups to enter and succeed in the profession.

With a first-year goal to underwrite 150 STEM scholars, FOSSI will provide \$40K scholarships to students pursuing STEM degrees at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), and connect these students to internships, leadership development, and mentoring opportunities at participating companies.

Founded by the American Chemistry Council (ACC), the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE), Chemours, and HBCU Week Foundation, FOSSI is a core initiative of the AIChE Doing a World of Good campaign and its All for Good: Engineering for Inclusion priority.

"We're not simply standing at the threshold of a new age of engineering, we're taking action and leading the way to a stronger, more inclusive future workforce for our industry," said **FOSSI Founding Chair Mark** Vergnano, President and CEO, Chemours. FOSSI Founding Partner and ACC President and CEO Chris Jahn added, "By opening the doors of opportunity through programs like FOSSI, our ability to make a positive impact on the world is boundless." WE ARE ENGINEERING CHANGE

In the six years since its launch, the Doing a World of Good campaign has almost doubled its \$15 million campaign goal. Thanks to the generous gifts from individual and corporate supporters, over \$27 million has been raised to fund programs that continue to push the boundaries of engineering.

RESEARCH & INNOVATION

The engineering landscape is evolving at an ever more rapid rate. The push for sustainable and innovative solutions providing food, water, energy, and consumer goods has never been greater, and the need for vaccines and new medicines has never been more urgent.

At AIChE, we're creating and funding programs like the Langer Prizes for Innovation and Entrepreneurial Excellence, which awards unrestricted grants of up to \$100,000 to researchers so they can continue making discoveries that open doors to new frontiers in areas including biotechnology, biomedical

engineering, pharmaceutical engineering, and drug delivery.

Other programs that the Doing a World of Good campaign funds include the **Stephanopoulos Award for Metabolic Engineering**, the **Water Initiative** to help make the most of our water supply, and the **Energy Initiative** that helps engineers working in multiple disciplines network together and integrate their ideas to advance energy solutions.

At AIChE, by supporting innovation in chemical engineering, by funding programs that spark positive change, and by advocating for engineers who push the boundaries of the profession,

SAFETY & ETHICAL PRACTICE

education at the university level, ensuring engineering students enter the workforce with a fullyoperational knowledge of process safety practices.

Since launching UPSLI in 2015,



and HBCU Week Foundation, FOSSI removes barriers that obstruct success by providing scholarships that underwrite four-year tuition for students majoring in STEM at Historically Black College and Universities (HBCUs). Of equal importance, internships, mentorships, and leadership training are also made available through AlChE and its corporate partners, providing students the resources and support they need to graduate, enter, and succeed in the profession.

Of course, at AIChE, support for the underrepresented is not new to us. It's why we fund the **Rising Star Workshop** and **Leadership Equity**

more than 182,615 (SAChE®) certificates were awarded to students worldwide, with 673 universities and 657 faculty members participating.

By teaching and advancing worldwide standards in process safety education, we're reducing incidents and accidents, as well as making the world more livable for everyone.

ALL FOR GOOD

All for Good: Engineering for Inclusion is a core priority of the Doing a World of Good campaign. With a goal to achieve parity in the workplace, we're funding important new programs to address gender, racial, and other imbalances in the engineering workforce. That means cultivating inclusion from the classroom to the boardroom — attracting, retaining, and advancing the next generation of engineers.

Identifying and encouraging talent begins early. The AIChE K-12 STEM Showcase and Outreach Competition introduces students from underrepresented communities to the boundless world of science and discovery.

Those who continue on this track can take advantage of the **Future of STEM Scholars Initiative (FOSSI)**. Founded by AlChE, the American Chemistry Council (ACC), Chemours,

It's also why we support and fund programming developed by Women in Chemical Engineering, Minorities Affairs Committee, Disabilities OutReach and Inclusion Community, and LGBTQ+ & Allies.
