SAFETY & ETHICAL PRACTICE

Doing things safely, responsibly, and ethically is at the heart of Doing a World of Good.

The Undergraduate Process Safety Learning Initiative (UPSLI) is a major global effort and core campaign priority to accelerate process safety education and better

prepare graduates for the workforce.

Since launching UPSLI in 2015, more than 226,148 Safety and Chemical Engineering Education (SAChE®) certificates have been awarded to students worldwide, with 734 universities participating in the UPSLI curriculum, and 789 faculty members educated at industryhosted workshops.

By teaching and advancing worldwide standards in process safety education, we're helping to minimize safety incidents, and to make the world we live in more livable for everyone.

ATTRACTING & RETAINING THE BEST & THE BRIGHTEST

The Doing a World of Good campaign supports programming that is attracting people who bring different experiences and points-of-view to chemical engineering, broadening its appeal and helping to open the doors of the profession to all.

With a goal to achieve parity in the workplace by 2050, **All for Good: Engineering for Inclusion** is funding important new programs to address gender, racial, and other imbalances in the engineering workforce. Our programs are cultivating inclusion from the classroom to the boardroom — attracting, retaining, and advancing the best of the next generation of chemical engineers.



The Future of STEM Scholars
Initiative (FOSSI) was established
in 2020 to help eliminate
financial barriers for historically
underrepresented groups and
increase diversity in the STEM

freshmen pursuing preferred

(HBCUs). Scholars receive \$10,000

the engineering profession more attractive to the next generation, raise awareness among K-12 teachers and students about STEM, and increase enrollment in engineering/STEM-focused undergraduate majors. It will also change public perceptions of engineering by reinforcing that it is the best profession to address global challenges concerning the quality of life and sustainability on our planet.

The AIChE LGBTQ+ & Allies Initiative aims to increase inclusion, participation, and progress of all gender and sexual minorities within the profession. To expand

this program, the LGBTQ+ & Allies Initiative Endowment Steering Committee collectively underwrote a \$10,000 matching gift challenge, celebrating PRIDE and allyship in honor of LGBTQ+ History Month in October.

EDUCATION, TRAINING, & CAREER DEVELOPMENT

By funding education, training, and career development programs, AIChE is ensuring that chemical engineers have access to programs that allow them to reach their potential and have a positive impact on the world.

Convening once every five years, the Summer School for Chemical Engineering Faculty brings together nearly 200 new professors with more experienced faculty peers to enhance teaching techniques, build collaborations, and increase networking and mentoring connections.

Thanks to a generous gift from long-time AlChE volunteers Christine and Regan Seymour, Lehigh University Class of 2021 BS ChE graduates each received an additional year of free AlChE Young Professional Membership to add to their first free year, which is sponsored by AlChE.

The AIChE Foundation had another successful year with the **Leadership Workshop for Rising Star Women Engineers**. This signature event for high performing early- to mid-career women drew nearly 250 attendees from industry and academia. The program utilizes best practices and research on gender to advance professional goals.
