proud of the VLS
progress thus far.

We have grown to

over 525 members in 30 countries. Our programming has covered everything from Institute issues to emerging technology, industrial history to the basics of finances. We've had some success, some failures, and learned and grown from it all. I'd like to take a moment to highlight some of our progress in the past year, and reflect on the goals we have yet to achieve.

Some of the major goals of 2015 are to secure and advertise speakers further in advance, create a greater sense of inclusion within the organization, and increase active involvement.

Overall, there has been greatest success in this first goal. I attribute this to a high level of involvement and commitment by our Board of Directors. As I hope you have seen, we have mostly been able to advertise, at minimum in our newsletters and meetings, upcoming programming significantly far in advance. This is a benefit to allow members to plan ahead if there is a speaker they are particularly interested in viewing. We have also been increasingly

successful advertising on our VLS webpage, LinkedIn, and within the Local Section community. Unfortunately, this has not increased attendance as much as we hope, a goal we will continue to work on throughout the year and beyond.

One of the unique challenges of being a virtual local section is creating a sense of community and ensuring members have a personal connection to the club. Three specific meetings have been created this year in attempt to solicit interaction by members and work to meet this second goal. We kicked off the year with a talk by Dan Lambert to celebrate our five-year anniversary and solicit feedback on how to improve service to our members as one idea to accomplish this second goal. In addition, our July meeting will be hosted by John O'Connell, past Fellows Council Chair, who will help a panel of fellows answer questions by members and solicit feedback and stories by active fellows in the audience. Lastly, our September meeting will be a Student Industrial Internship Contest.

One of our biggest struggles as an organization has been to create active involvement within the organization. This local section, and this professional organization, would not be possible without the dozens of volunteer faces behind it. From assisting roles with smaller time commitments, to elected positions, each is vital it in its own way. Next month, we will begin forming our nomination committee to

fill 2016 positions. You may think about running, or about assisting on the committee. Some other tasks we are always looking for assistance on are Young Professional activities, advertising, and programming. As the saying goes, what you get out is what you put in.

I hope you have enjoyed your experience with the Virtual Local Section, and that you plan on continuing your membership in 2016. # SEPTEMBER STUDENT SHOWCASE

Co-op and Summer Internship Presentation Competition

Students, did you enjoy your time as an industrial intern or co-op, and work on a unique or exciting project? Want to share your work with a broader audience?

Enter the Virtual AIChE Presentation Contest for a chance to share your experience, practice your presentation skills and win great awards!

Participants must been undergraduate chemical engineering students (graduating Dec 2015 or later). The work presented must have been done this year as part of an industrial co-op or summer internship.

Teams of 2 students are permitted if both meet qualifications.

Students should present their original work done during the co-op or summer internship. *Before submitting an abstract*, obtain the required written approval from your supervisors, and mentors and anyone else required by the regulations of your

your industrial sponsors. Students whose abstracts are accepted must be available for live virtual presentations at the VLS Meeting on September 24, 2015 at 8:30 PM Eastern Daylight Time (USA) with a microphone and internet connection.

Presentations should be less than 10 minutes and will be judged by practicing chemical engineers using the following criteria:

- Application and demonstration of chemical engineering principles in the students' work
- Understanding of the process and underlying chemistry and physics
- Clarity and appearance of slides and presentation
- Understanding how the student's work could be used, applied, or extended into other applications and industries
- Ability to answer questions
