The financial health of the Division is good. For a number of years now income and expenses are fairly balanced with the year-end balances between \$70,000 and \$80,000. Half of the income is from membership dues. This income has been fairly stable, an indication that membership has stayed stable as well. Most of the expenses are related to awards.

In 2018 25% of the Division funds were allocated in a CD option offered by AIChE and 75% in the AIChE's investment portfolio.

There was a suggestion to combine the Division poster session and Area 2h (General Topics) poster session into one poster session owned by area 2h.

There was a discussion on Topical conferences. Organizers of Topical conference rarely reach out to the Division, even though many of the Topical conferences include separations at their core. Currently there is no requirement for Topical organizers to communicate with related divisions. The Division leadership proposed such requirement at the meeting of the Executive Board of the Program Committee (EBPC). In the meantime, the Division interest will be served well if one of the Directors assumes responsibility for Topical conference coordinator / liaison. In this role the Director will proactively communicate with Topical conference organizers and solicit Topical proposals from the Division.

#### New Business: ExxonMobil's Corporate Strategic Research 50th Anniversary (Roger Whitley)

ExxonMobil's Corporate Strategic Research group is interested in organizing two sessions in honor of their Corporate Strategic Research (CRS)'s 50th anniversary at the 2019 AIChE Annual Meeting. The general idea is to celebrate past and future ExxonMobil through forward-looking topics and technical talks highlighting the rigor of ExxonMobil's fundamental research portfolio in the areas of separations and catalysis and reaction engineering. The talks would be invited and high-level.

AIChE has agreed to give Separations and Reaction Engineering Divisions the two oral sessions (one for each Division). ExxonMobil will be managing all contributions. ExxonMobil only asks the sessions to be scheduled with minimal topic overlap.

#### New Business: Using AIChE Engage to Better Serve Members (Roger Whitley)

The Division currently uses two platforms to communicate with and serve members: the Division web site (managed by Megan Donaldson) and LinkedIN (managed by Marcus Mello). The Division web site is mainly for storing content and occasional announcements. It is inflexible and difficult to update. The LinkedIn Separations Division group is used for notices and some discussion but has only 165 members.

AIChE Engage is a fairly new platform with Web and App interfaces. Options exist to set up private groups, such as for Division and Area levels. It was suggested that the Division should evaluate AIChE Engage for its potential use as a platform to communicate with members. In a related context, the Division needs to decide how many communication platforms should be maintained. This is a project that can use Director leadership.

The 2017 newsletter is almost complete but needs a column from the 2017 Division chair. The preparation of the 2018 newsletter will begin after the completion of the 2018 Annual meeting.

#### Other Business: AIChE E-Mailing List for the Division (Roger Whitley)

During the Division elections, it was found out that several Division officers who have paid their Institute and Division dues for 2018 were not on the AIChE distribution email list.




