Message from the Chair

I want to open by thanking Mark Mathis for giving us a glimpse into the developing world of meat alternatives and cultured meats. I never imagined the day might come in which we'd grow artificial beef in laboratories. Much of this technology isn't cost effective yet, but neither was the now ubiquitous automobile in its beginning. Biochemical and chemical engineers will play a big part of driving this new technology to success just like we were a big part of why cars became so successful.

After taking this look into the future we'll take a step back into the distant past at one of the oldest, if not the oldest, chemical engineering process, brewing beer. It is thought that beer brewing goes back at least 6,000 years. It was probably discovered by accident, and it was not until the last couple of centuries that it began to be more science and a little less art. It has 4 principal unit operations: malting, mashing, fermentation and maturation/filtering. Careful temperature control is important in all steps and the last step requires either heat pasteurization to kill the yeast and stop fermentation or cold filtering to remove the yeast and stop fermentation. As one skilled in the art of filtration, I find the cold filtering process, frequently using membrane ultrafilters, fascinating. It makes for some interesting reading if you have the time. So, join us April 11th at Birds Fly South Ale Project in Greenville for a behind-the-scenes tour of the beer production process. They make larger volume lager and an "urban farmhouse beer" which you'll just have to come and see as I am not sure I can do it justice here.

I would also like to remind everyone that we have an important vote on revised bylaws at the April meeting. As we have said many times, this is your local section; so, make your voice heard.
