### WIC Women's Workplace Retention & Reentry (W2R2): Reentry to Industry: Keynote, Panel Discussion & Workshop

The AIChE Women's Initiatives Committee offered a new workshop dedicated to retention and reentry of women to the engineering profession at the 2016 Spring AIChE Conference. The 3-hour workshop focused on reentry to industry to provide key strategies for getting back into the workforce after taking time off. The keynote speech was delivered by Beth Bryce (Career Services Director, Adult Degree & DeVos Graduate School of Management, Northwood University). Beth talked about how to position seasoned professionals for success by providing 12 career transition strategies that will deliver the changes they are seeking in their career.

The Keynote speech was followed by a panel discussion (Participants: Beth Bryce (Career Services Director, Adult Degree & DeVos Graduate School of Management, Northwood University), Julie Mialaret (General Manager Safety - Upstream Americas, Shell), Cynthia DeBisschop (Adjunct Faculty, Howard University) and Teresa Newman (Principal Engineer, Lubrizol)).

At our spring meeting networking luncheon, Laura E. Leonard (Senior Product Line Manager, Gasoline Technologies, Process Technology & Equipment, UOP, A Honeywell Company) delivered a keynote presentation entitled "Work Life Balance: A Two Variable Equation with Many Solutions."
