The annual meeting was held in Minneapolis in October. WIC Unconscious Bias Workshop

Understanding Unconscious Bias in the Workplace

Do we all biases? What are the biases that we personally have or see in others around us? These were some of the intriguing questions discussed at a recent AIChE workshop. Following the continuous efforts of advancing inclusiveness, the <u>AIChE Foundation</u> sponsored the Workshop: <u>Understanding Unconscious Bias in the Workplace</u> as part of the Development Topical Conference that took place at the 2018 Spring Meeting. The event was co-sponsored by AIChE Women's Initiatives Committee (WIC) and AIChE Minorities Affairs Committee (MAC).

Overall, the participants learned about how their belief systems, principles and stereotypes can influence their interactions and decisions in the workplace. The workshop was a call to action – to be proactive and mindful of our own biases as we engage with others to build inclusivity. This session was led by Cynthia Murphy-Ortega (Chevron) and Sindia Rivera-Jiménez (University of Florida). With her unique industry perspective, Murphy-Ortega introduced unconscious bias (or implicit bias) as unconscious beliefs or stereotypes that influence our actions and decisions when interacting with other people. Rivera-Jiménez reviewed the fundamental ideas related to the bias habit and showed the attendees various strategies to "detect, reflect on, and or reject" those attitudes and prejudices. Both moderators noted various times that all humans have implicit biases and, without self-judgment, we need to become aware and take action.

Real Stories of Unconscious Bias in the Workplace

An invited panel of professionals shared stories of unconscious bias in the workplace that were not limited to gender biases. Biases concerning race, gender, economic status, and disabilities, were discussed in a welcoming environment. The panelists included Bill Byers (CH2M Hill and AIChE's 2004 President), Kevin J. Edwards, (Bechtel Infrastructure), LaRuth McAfee (University of Wisconsin, Madison), and Cynthia Murphy-Ortega. Moderated by Rivera-Jiménez, the attendees were open to sharing their own experiences and, together, find ways where they can improve their



awareness and actions for having a more inclusive environment in our workplace. Many of the attendees thanked WIC for providing them with a common language and examples to discuss this important topic with their peers. This inaugural session laid an excellent foundation for future sessions on this topic and the broader area of diversity and inclusion.
