TECHNICAL AND INTERPERSONAL CHALLENGES

Phil Tencer shared project leadership tips and tricks with our local section during the October meeting with a primary focus on interpersonal challenges. He noted that technical success requires a suite of technical ability and another, just as critical, interpersonal capability to ensure collaboration and stakeholder buy in. Each social style has unique struggles along with strengths (slay your personal dragon). Also, during stress,

or faced with conflict, each social style has a natural reaction. A successful leader will look past the stress response and strive for collaboration (vs. compromise) to achieve the best solution. Collaboration requires shared trust, purpose, approach and finally results. Without trust and shared purpose the team is unlikely to work well together or come up with the best solution. Lastly, he left us with some resources were we can

learn more. Eastman offers classes on social styles and the consultative process (there are also many books on the subject if you are not an Eastman employee or want to learn on your own).
