#### UPCOMING MARCH PROGRAM CRYSTALLIZATION TECHNIQUES

GFA's business area "Solutions" specializes in the design and development of process solutions for the dairy, brewery, food, pharmaceutical, and chemical industries. GEA is recognized as a world leader within liquid processing, concentration (membrane systems, evaporation, and crystallization), industrial drying, powder processing and handling, emission control, solid dosage processing, and aseptic packaging. The Chemical Solutions Group located in Columbia, Maryland handles inquiries for process systems installation in the Unites States and

Canada. GEA's process technology center (PTC) for crystallization is located in Europe, working primarily with Kestner and Messo technologies. The PTC staff collaborates with the process engineering team in Columbia, Maryland to handle inquiries and to provide basic engineering during contract execution. Crystallization technologies offered by GEA include solution crystallization, melt crystallization and freeze concentration.
