LETTER FROM THE CHAIR TENI BUTLER

Hello, all! As a board, we've made a few changes throughout this past year, and we have been so appreciative of your support for those changes. All the changes that have been implemented have been driving toward the goal of providing relevant services to our members and active participants in a way that can be sustained year over year. Our vision is to provide support in the areas of leadership career and development, continuing education, networking, and local community impact.

In April, members received a survey from the board asking your reaction to changing our local section dues structure. We want to thank you all for your feedback - 90% of all respondents were in favor of a raise in local section dues to help us sustainably support our vision. Taking into consideration the responses provided by our local section members, the board voted in May to increase our local section dues from \$10/ year to \$15/year. This change will take effect for anyone renewing dues into 2020, which we sincerely hope you all intend to do! To give you an idea of the impact of this increase: this increase in dues will cover 63% of our yearly programming costs as compared to 42% average coverage in previous 3 years. We also foresee needs for our other active committees and are intent providing support where needed to expand their reach and offerings for you all. We anticipate that this change will allow our continue bringing section to quality programming to our area, empower our Professional Engagement Committee to continue hosting networking and our development events, and enable Outreach Committee to continue partnering with other local professional organizations to further the role of STEM education in the K-12 system. We look forward to leveraging the extra income from dues to complement our fundraising efforts (short course offerings), to continue providing the best possible slate of programs and events to you year-over-year. SHORT COURSE

ADVANCED CONCEPTS FOR PROCESS HAZARD ANALYSIS

The East Tennessee Chapter of AIChE will be hosting Robert Johnson, a Process Safety instructor at The Ohio State University, and primary author of the CCPS book Guidelines for Hazard Evaluation Procedures, to teach a two-day course on Advanced Concepts for Process Hazard Analysis.

Beyond the Basics: In two days, you'll work with a team to learn and practice the PHA techniques successfully being applied in the process safety industry today. Using a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet provided during the course, you'll document and analyze HAZOP Studies. You'll then modify your spreadsheet to include findings and recommendations as pseudo safeguards. You'll also examine the concept of importance measures applied to PHAs and how to use a PHA to identify safety instrumented systems (SIS) and safety integrity levels (SIL). You'll conclude the course by reporting your HAZOP Study results in a team presentation before other course participants.

This training is targeted at anyone interested in expanding their knowledge and understanding of the PHA process.

The class is scheduled from 8AM-5PM August 20 & 21. Breakfast and Lunch will be provided. The class will be hosted in B-150 on Eastman's campus. To register within Eastman please sign up through MLL. The course carries 15 PDH, equivalent to 1.5 CEU. The course cost is \$1,495 (subject to attendance).
