

AFTER-DINNER PROGRAM: "The Development of Thermodynamics"

Thermodynamics deals with the relations between heat, work and energy. The development of the concepts of these three quantities and their quantitative expression will be traced from the vague, purely qualitative speculations of the Greeks as early as the third or fourth century B.C. up to the work of Gibbs in the latter half of the 19th century.

The talk will center around the lives, personalities and contributions of some of the men who have pioneered in the development of thermo and its practical applications. Some of the most prominent are Francis Bacon (Lord Verulan), Galileo, Newton, Black, Newcomen, Watt, Fahrenheit, Celsius, Benjamin Thompson (Count Rumford), Davy, Charles, Gay-Lussac, Carnot, Clapeyron, Wm. Thomson (Lord Kelvin), Joule, Mayer, Clausius, Helmholtz, Rankine, Maxwell and Gibbs.

Each of these men made important contributions and the lives of some of them make an interesting story in itself.

Speaker . . . Dr. Barnett F. Dodge

This month's speaker, Dr. Barnett Dodge, Professor Emeritus, Yale University, needs no introduction to those in the field of chemical engineering. He has an outstanding background both in industry and education. Along with his career activities, Dr. Dodge has served the Institute as a Director and as President and is a recipient of both the Walker and Warren K. Lewis Awards. In addition to his book, "Chemical Engineering Thermodynamics," he has authored over 100 technical papers. We feel honored to present this leader in the development of chemical engineering.
