Abstract:

Food processing plants are governed by regulations promulgated and enforced by several federal agencies, including the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS), the Environmental Protection Administration (EPA), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), and, often, state public health agencies. The recently passed Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) granted additional authority to FDA, among other measures, to compel recalls, to regulate foreign food suppliers to the US market, and to require Hazard Analysis Critical Control Points (HACCP) plans or their equivalent in all US food plants.

Biography:

Peter Clark is a consulting process engineer in Oak Park, IL and Contributing Editor of Food Technology magazine, with a monthly column on processing since 2002. Previously, he was Vice President, Technology with Fluor Daniel (a major engineering firm); Senior Vice President, Process Technology of A. Epstein and Sons International (a large architecture and engineering firm with a food practice) and Presi-

dent of Epstein Process Engineering (a subsidiary); Director of Research for ITT Continental Baking Company; Assistant, then Associate Professor of Chemical Engineering at Virginia Tech; and he be-



gan his career as a Research Engineer with the U. S. Agricultural Research Service.

He earned his B.S.Ch.E from Notre Dame and his Ph. D. From the University of California -Berkeley. He has published over forty papers and eight books in addition to his columns. He is a registered professional engineer in Illinois and Virginia, is a Fellow of AIChE and of IFT, a Certified Food Scientist, and past chair of IFT Food Engineering Division and the New Products and Technologies Committee and of AIChE Food, Pharmaceutical and Bioengineering Division, from which he received the Division Award in 1998. In 2010, he received the Ernest Thiele Award, sponsored by BP, from the AIChE Chicago Section. In 2011 he received a Life Achievement Award from the International Association for Engineering and Food. He has worked as a volunteer or paid consultant in India, Israel, Egypt, Haiti, Moldova, Malawi, Kenya, Uzbekistan, Albania, Mexico, Canada, France, Germany, and England.
