Refrigerants

Speaker's Bio:

Mark Skierkiewicz has been employed as an engineer at UL for over 12 years. During that time Mr. Skierkiewicz was responsible for evaluating/investigating heat pump, air conditioning, ventilation and process cooling products for domestic international and markets. Mr. Skierkiewicz also has knowledge of US and International regulatory standards, approval and testing requirements. Mr. Skierkiewicz holds a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering, a master's degree in Mathematics and is a licensed Professional Engineer in the State of Illinois. He is a Member of ASHRAE, participates in the multidisciplinary task group for Low Global Warming Potential (LowGWP) refrigerants and is a corresponding member of ASHRAE TC5.10.

Abstract:

The phase-out and restriction of the most common and widely used refrigerants was initiat-



ed in the late 1980's and has spurred innovation, both for the alternative refrigerants that have been introduced as well as the equipment that uses them. Several refrigerants have been identified as potential replacement for refrigerants currently used in HVAC and refrigerants systems. Safety evaluation of these refrigerants requires an understanding of refrigerant flammability in representativescale settings so that equipment can be appropriately designed and installed for safe operation.

This presentation will provide an introduction on the current status of codes and standards in the United States and Canada. Research on the use of these refrigerants has both been conducted to determine the efficiency of equipment as well as to determine hazards that could exist if the refrigerants were to be introduced into occupied spaces. The applications for Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration (HVAC/R) equipment varies greatly depending on the global region that it is installed. Because the equipment varies, the research conducted covers a wide range as well. Testing is conducted a the small scale to determine and identify if the material is flammable and how quickly any flames will propagate. There has also been several full scale tests conducted to determine the interaction with occupied spaces during abnormal conditions. The research is being used to shape codes and standards and is being used to better design the next generation of HVAC equipment. However, as with all research there are limitations, and these past projects have identified additional questions that will need to answered. There is ongoing and future planned research that will help answer some of these questions and ensure that the next generation of refrigerants can be implemented and used in a safe manner.

- Jurisdiction of local section has the addition of Grundy, Kendall, and Will counties.
- Board of directors includes elected officials but not standing committees. This
 was done to provide more flexibility for purposes of quorum.
- Committees were consolidated, restructured, renamed, and/or reduced from 18 standing committees under 6 groups to 11 standing committees under 4 groups. This more closely reflects practices and volunteer levels of recent years.
