



#### **BIOGRAPHY**

Dr. Reardon is a native of North Carolina and received a B.S. in Chemistry from UNC Chapel Hill and an M.S. in Chemical Engineering from North Carolina State University. He worked for Dupont from 1980 - 1989 and co/BP/Solvay from 1989 until 2006. Most of his experience was as a Process Control Engineer but has worked as a Process Engineer, Project Engineer and Production Manager. At Amoco/BP he was involved in the implementation of ISO 9000, OSHA's PSM, EPA's RMP, OSHA's Voluntary Protection Program.

In 2004, Dr. Reardon was awarded a Ph.D. In Adult Education from UGA where his dissertation topic was "Blue-Collar Worker Response to Imposed Technological Change." Since 2006, he has worked as an Associate Professor of Adult Education at Texas State University in San Marcos. His research interests include Workplace Learning, Chemistry Education, and Models of Leadership.

Since 2010. Dr. Reardon has worked as a Consultant and Instructor for Primatech, Inc. He teaches PHA Team Leadership, LOPA Team Leadership, PSM Program Development, PSM Program Auditing, Effective Procedure Writing, and SIL Verification.

Dr. Reardon has been a Member of the Chemical Committee of the National Council of Examiner for Engineering and Land Surveying (NCEES) since 1991. This committee is responsible for development of the P.E. examination that is administered in the US. In 2014, Dr. Reardon was recognized by the AIChE for his part in developing the Body of Knowledge for Chemical Engineers.

**Practical Applica**tion of Adult Learning Theory to Operator Training

# **ABSTRACT**



The training of operators in refineries, chemical plants, and other facilities associated with the chemical processing industry is key to company success. The designs of modern chemical facilities are complex with literally thousands of instruments, pumps, vessels, pipes, tubes, computers, networks and other components. Many facilities operate 24 hours a day with minimum staffing working alone or in pairs. Operators and technicians must learn to diagnose and respond to abnormal or perceived abnormal con-

ditions. Training of operators is required by

OSHA and EPA regulations and is an expecta-

tion of most quality programs.

The traditional model of classroom training is not sufficient to produce competent chemical plant operators. Alternative techniques include online instruction, simulators, apprenticeships, and mentoring. These techniques help develop operators but, as is true with most workplace learning, the majority of learning done by operators is informal. The operators share ideas and techniques demonstrate to each other. Shortcuts are shared. Operators find hazards and share them with their peers. Much of this learning is beneficial but even bad ideas are shared.

In this session, I will briefly discuss some adult learning theory, review some of the regulatory requirements and discuss some concepts of alternative training formats. For the majority of the presentation, I will present some ways to leverage informal learning to reinforce formal training and procedures. Training matrices will be discussed with an example.

The participants will participate in two brief exercises to demonstrate informal learning.


