# **Chair's Corner**

We had an excellent September meeting that included a tour of the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant led by Dr. Dominic Brose of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. I'm certain everyone learned something about the importance of environmental chemistry and how wastewater operations continue to evolve to better serve the needs of the public and protect the environment.

Last month, I summarized what I feel is the Chicago Section's core mission. I would like to elaborate on how our monthly meetings are aligned with that mission:

- Promote excellence in chemical engineering education and local practice;
  - \* Technical speakers provide ongoing engineering education after graduation.
  - Meetings provide CEUs/PDHs for licensure to practice.
- Advance the development and exchange of relevant knowledge;
  - \* Technical speakers are subject matter experts and many conduct research and
  - \* development in their fields.
  - Members are provided opportunities to talk about their experience and perspectives on issues raised by the technical speaker.
- Uphold and advance the profession's standards, ethics and diversity;
  - Technical speakers are selected to represent the standards of engineering, including ethics.
  - Technical speakers are selected to promote diversity.
- Enhance the lifelong career development and financial security of chemical engineers through networking;
  - Meetings include a social hour for networking.
  - \* Members of AIChE and the Chicago Section receive registration fee discounts to promote attendance.
- Stimulate collaborative efforts among industry, universities, and professional societies;
  - Meetings are selected to include occasional facility tours.
  - \* The January meeting is a joint meeting with the ACS local section.
  - \* The April meeting is a local university and includes a student competition.
  - Students receive registration fee discounts to promote attendance.
- Achieve excellence in operations of the Chicago Section
  - \* Meetings are entirely planned by volunteers from their offices or homes.
  - Cvent provides a meeting website platform and email-based registration.
  - Cvent and Stripe allow for offsite and onsite registration using credit cards, which is preferred by most attendees.

Overall, the finances of the monthly meetings are intended to be neutral such that the registration fees are balanced with the venue and meal expenses. In 2018-2019, the average expense for a meeting attendee was approximately \$35 per person. The full price of a registration in 2018-2019 was set as \$50 for the general public and is set high enough to always generate revenue for the Chicago Section. Discounts on registration fees that are below the meeting cost are structured to advance the core mission:

 Students are provided a discount of approximately 70% (\$10 registration fee) to encourage them to network with experienced engineers. This student discount is offset by donations from other meeting attendees.



- Unemployed Chicago Section members are provided a discount of approximately 60% (\$15 registration fee) to reduce the hardship of paying for dinner at a restaurant so they can network. This discount has a negligible impact on the finances of the Chicago Section.
- Retired Chicago Section members are provided a discount of approximately 60% (\$15 registration fee) to reduce the hardship of paying for dinner at a restaurant. Many of the retirees who attend Chicago Section members are actively involved in the Chicago Section, and their presence is important for passing down knowledge and wisdom about the engineering profession. This discount is not offset by another current income source; however, the strong cash position of the Chicago Section is largely a result of the past efforts of retirees and can sustain this discount for years to come.

I am in support of sustaining all these discounts and would like to propose one more where I think there may be a long-term benefit to the Chicago Section. Currently, young professionals (YPs) are required to pay a registration fee of \$40 as a Chicago Section member. Given that YPs are in the process of paying student loans, saving to buy houses, and having young children, I would like everyone to consider a new discount below the average meeting cost for YPs. This would encourage them to become more involved with senior chemical engineers. After the November meeting, I will lead the Board of Directors to review the meeting finances and to consider a new YP discount in addition to adjusting the registration fees for 2020 events if needed.

I would like to conclude by thanking our dedicated volunteers in the Programming and Logistics committees. Our elected Vice Chairs Programming, Ha Dinh and Sarika Goel, have done an outstanding job soliciting speakers and coordinating their attendance. Our Logistics Committee, Paolo Palmas and Lance Baird, have done the grunt work of obtaining agreements with restaurants and coordinating with restaurant managers to make sure that the meal preparation is flawless.

# **October Meeting**

### Dr. Norman Li

President, NL Chemical Technology, Inc.

## Biography:

Dr. Norman Li is president of NL Chemical Technology, Inc. Mount Prospect, Illinois. He was at Exxon Research and Engineering Co. as a senior scientist and at UOP and Honeywell as Director of Research. In 1995, recognizing the critical needs of clean water in many parts of the world, he founded the NL Chemical Technology, Inc. to develop cost-effective advanced membrane technologies for worldwide operations of water purification and desalination of seawater. Dr. Li has made major technical contributions to the advancement of



chemical engineering in general and separation science and technology in particular. He has more than 100 technical publications, 44 U.S. patents, and 21 books edited, all in the field of separation science and technology. Dr. Li has received many honors and awards. He was elected to the National Academy of Engineering of USA in 1990 and was elected to be one of the "100 Distinguished Chemical Engineers in the US" at the Centennial Celebration of American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) in 2008.

Dr. Li has received the AlChE's Founders Award and the Institute Lectureship; the American Chemical Society (ACS)'s Award of Separation Science and Technology and the E. V. Murphree Award in Industrial and Engineering Chemistry. In addition, he received the Perkin Medal from the Society of Chemical Industry - the highest honor in the chemical industry in the US, and the Alan S. Michaels Award, the highest honor in the membrane field, from the North American Membrane Society (NAMS). The International Congress on Membranes and Membrane Processes and AIChE all held special symposia in his honor at their international conferences.

### Abstract:

## "Membrane for a Thirsty World"

The provision of clean drinking water, the treatment and reuse of waste water, the desalination of sea water and the efficient recycling of streams and intermediates in chemical manufacturing processes are among the pressing challenges facing the world today. Membrane technology offers one of the most important responses to these challenges, with an astonishing rate of growth.

The major efforts of present industrial research and development of advanced membrane technology are focused on improving the effectiveness and efficiency of the polymeric membranes. This presentation will first review the history of the development of industrial membranes and their manufacturing processes. It will then focus on Reverse Osmosis and

Nanofiltration membranes. Their special features of anti-fouling, low-energy consumption and high selectivity for certain minerals will be discussed.

On the membrane manufacturing process, we have the total experience from developing laboratory research results to commercial processes. The future directions of the industrial R&D in this field will be discussed.




