MEMBER FEEDBACK SURVEY:

Due to the global pandemic, the North Jersey Section has been conducting virtual monthly meetings for several months now. (*Please refer to the meeting summaries below*). As pandemic restrictions began loosening at the end of the summer, the Section considered reimplementing in-person meetings if appropriate. In order to gauge the memberships' feelings about this idea, and to help in the decision-making, the Section invited feedback by the membership via a three-question survey, via Survey Monkey.

The three questions asked were:

- 1. Would you currently feel comfortable attending a dinner meeting in a restaurant? Please indicate "YES" or "NO
- 2. If you answered "NO", what would have to happen before you felt comfortable?
- 3. Do you have any general comments or suggestions that would help the Executive Committee plan events for the coming months?

At the time the survey was taken, 75% of the respondents replied "NO" to **Question #1**. The reasons given in **Question #2** ranged from developing a vaccine, to attaining low levels of virus spread. Comments from **Question #3** included an overwhelming agreement to continuing virtual meetings, to "*maintain cohesiveness and momentum*" among other things. Looking to the future, a mixture of live and virtual meetings was also suggested.

The Executive Committee appreciated this feedback, as it helped us plan Section activities according to the best interests and current needs of the membership. Thank you to all who participated. We will be sending out another survey in the coming months, as conditions change, in order to re-evaluate this situation.

NJIT Student Chapter, AIChE presents:

Hy-Lander - Their award-winning ChemE-Car

Earlier this fall, NJIT's ChemE-Car team participated in the Mid-Atlantic Region of the ChemE-Car Competition, which took place virtually as part of the 2020 AlChE Regional Conference, hosted by Virginia Tech University. NJIT's team won 2nd place in the *Poster Competition*, and 3rd place in the *Chem-E-Car Performance Competition*. These wins enabled NJIT's team to advance to the national competition, which was held virtually at the AlChE Annual Student Conference on November 15, 2020.

The ChemE-Car Competition involves constructing, fueling and running a car via a chemical reaction. Additionally, a poster must be developed, that describes the particular chemical reaction mechanism(s) driving the car. The Hy-lander, NJIT's ChemE-Car, is a hydrogen gas (produced onboard via an acid-metal reaction) - powered vehicle that generates electricity via a fuel cell. Additionally, it uses a secondary reaction to stop the car. At the competition, the car is required to carry a load of water a designated distance. The weight of the water is unknown until the day of the competition, and the ChemE Car Team must perform calculations onsite, to adjust their reaction, so that their car carries the water as close to the designated distance as possible. In winning 3rd Place, The Hy-lander carried its load of water 2 meters beyond the 13.7 meter designated distance.

At the AlChE Annual Student Conference in November, the team won **First Place** for their poster - Congratulations ChemE Car Team! Unfortunately, after completing their first run just 1.5 meters short of their

target, some unforeseen technical trouble hampered their efforts to complete their car's second run. Congratulations on reaching the national competition nonetheless!

At this virtual event, attendees met the members of NJIT's ChemE-Car team, who described their award-winning car and the chemical reaction powering it and reviewed their award-winning poster.
