## Mid-Michigan Section Recognizes Its Own at June 2002 Banquet

On June 7, the Mid-Michigan Section celebrated a special event, its **Fiftieth Anniversary** as an organized section, and recognized our volunteers at the Gladco Sky Room. By locating this year's awards banquet at MBS airport, our section was able to accommodate **Representative Dave Camp** as the keynote speaker. Rep. Camp gave us extemporaneous and poignant remarks on topics fresh in the minds of us all: energy, the economy, homeland defense, September 11, and government.

**Steve Weier** presented our sixth consecutive **Mid-Michigan AIChE Chemical Engineering College Scholarship**. This \$500 award given to a local student pursuing a chemical engineering education is renewable for up to four years. This year's recipient was **Casey Schmidt** from Pinconning Area High School. Casey will be attending Michigan Tech University starting in the fall of 2002. Steve wishes to thank the members of the selection committee, **Erin Lacher, Dave Tascarella, Josh Lien, and Victor Atiemo-Obeng**.

Each year, our chapter offers three scholarships to local ninth through eleventh-grade students who wish to attend the Michigan Technological University (MTU) Summer Youth Program Career Exploration (SYP). The SYP, which MTU has offered since 1973, gives students a chance to attend weeklong career explorations in fields ranging from society & culture to math, engineering, and science. The Mid-Michigan Section provides these scholarships with the hope of encouraging more students to consider professional careers in math, engineering, and science. The three winners of this year's SYP scholarships were **Kelly Quinn, Jeffrey Byrne**, both juniors at **Bangor John Glenn High School**, and **Robb Mrozinski**, a sophomore at **Pinconning Area High School**. Kelly and Jeff will be attending the General Engineering exploration, and Robb will be attending the Chemistry-Special Topics exploration. The scholarship includes room, board, and tuition at the SYP and a \$100 travel allotment to make the trek to Houghton, Michigan. The total cost to our chapter for this scholarship is \$1750.

To round out the evening, The Mid-Michigan Section presented awards to those who volunteered on the executive committee and for our service events. In addition, three special annual awards were announced.

Mike Durisin presented the **Chemical Engineer of the Year Award** for 2001-2002 to **Kip Mercure**. Dr. Mercure earned a B.S. degree in chemistry from the University of Michigan in 1972, joining Chrysler upon graduation and working in the area of catalytic converters. After contributions to Chrysler and then a stint traveling, he returned to school obtaining his Ph.D. in chemical engineering from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University working under Prof. Peter Rony. It was at this time that he became skilled in digital and analog design. He joined Dow Chemical in December 1984, working with the Engineering Research Laboratory in Central Research. During his time in this laboratory the CAMILE Products business (Control And Monitoring Interface for Laboratory Experiments), a hardware and software system for laboratory and pilot plant automation, was developed. Dr. Mercure has held many positions with-in Dow, including his current role in the New Products and Math Modeling part of the Materials Sciences and Information Research Laboratory. He joined AIChE in 1991, and he joined the Mid-Michigan section in 1997.

Mike Molnar introduced **Erik Ohare** as the Mid-Michigan Section **Young Chemical Engineer of the Year**. Erik graduated with a B.S. ChE from the University of Missouri-Rolla in 1992. Following graduation, he joined Hemlock Semiconductor Corporation, where he worked in many aspects associated with the production of semiconductor grade silicon. At this time his responsibilities included a four-year stint in HSC process engineering, the start-up coordinator for silicon production process during HSC's PHARO III expansion, and the team leader of HSC's newest silicon production building. In 1999, our



winner transferred from HSC to its parent organization, Dow Corning, where he has worked in the electronic chemicals business, and in particular, the Semiconductor Fabrication Materials market. There he has served as manufacturing team leader for H-Resin, a process engineering group leader for the development of new high purity resins, and most recently, a commercialization project leader specializing in materials for Flat Panel Displays and integrated circuits. As a member of our section, he has served many years as a member of our MTU Youth Scholarship committee and more recently, as the head of that committee.

Last, but certainly not least, Tim Huber presented the Mid-Michigan Section 2002 **Service to Society Award** to recipient **Victor Atiemo-Obeng**. The Service to Society Award is given to recognize continued achievement within the chemical engineering profession coupled with a lasting contribution of service to the community inside and outside of chemical engineering. Victor earned his B.S. ChE from the Catholic University of America, Washington DC and his Ph.D. in chemical engineering from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Victor joined Dow Chemical where his long list of experiences includes a recent promotion to the Scientist level. This promotion is in recognition of Victor's technical expertise as a consultant, leveraging mixing technology across many of Dow's businesses and project activities. He also leads the MET I (Most Effective Technology) efforts for the Fluid Mechanics and Mixing Discipline to standardize and enhance Dow's mixing technology while applying best practices globally. Victor's external activities include Dow representation in the North American Mixing Forum (NAMF) and the High Shear Dispersion Research Consortium at the University of Maryland. Victor's involvement with the Mid-Michigan Section has also been quite lengthy, serving as the section Chair Elect, Chair and Past Chair over the last ten years. He was recognized as the Chemical Engineer of the Year in 1995 and is currently serving as the Section's Dow Director.

### Mid-Michigan Section Honors Fifty-Year AIChE Members

As a part of our June banquet, the Mid-Michigan Section recognized some very special guests. Since our section celebrated fifty years of existence during 2001-2002, all current fifty-year AIChE members in the area were invited to attend and be honored for their service to both our and the national organization. We were delighted by the presence of several honorees. For the guests who could attend, our section was able to obtain biographical information to share with our audience.

#### *Garald Allen*

Garald Allen joined Dow Chemical in 1942, following the completion of his B. S. Chemistry degree at Albion College and an M.S. ChE at the University of Iowa. His first assignment at Dow was that of start-up engineer at Dow's newly constructed Ludington, MI facility. In 1944, he returned to Midland where he worked in several of Dow's Michigan Division businesses. These included CalMag, which had jurisdiction over various brine-based products (calcium chloride, Epsom salts) and later styrene production. He also worked in Technical Service. Prior to his retirement in 1974, Garald worked in the Dow's Government Affairs Division, being responsible for arranging research contracts between Dow Chemical and various branches of the United States Military.

Garald joined AIChE in 1945. This year marks his **fifty-seventh year of membership** in the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.



***Vern Fauver***

Vern Fauver enjoyed a long career at The Dow Chemical Company, spanning forty-two years (1954-1996). His contributions are numerous, particularly in the domain of air quality control and regulatory compliance. Since his retirement in 1996, he has worked as an independent consultant.

Vern's contributions to AIChE are well noted, particularly our local Section where he has held numerous roles. He served as Chair in 1979 and started our bi-annual Process Equipment and Instrumentation Exposition (Expo) in 1982. Expo is to this day our Section's most important fund-raising event, allowing us to fund our service activities. Vern has been a recipient of the Mid-Michigan Local Section Service to Society Award and in 1994 he was awarded Chemical Engineer of the Year.

Vern Fauver joined AIChE in 1952. This year marks his **fiftieth-anniversary of AIChE membership**.

***Eldon Graham***

Following the completion of his B.S. ChE from Purdue University, Eldon Graham worked for many years at The Dow Chemical Company. He worked initially as a chemical engineer in the Physical Research Laboratory where he performed research on thermal properties of materials, foamed plastics and rubber-reinforced plastics. After working as a group and later division leader, he joined the staff of the Corporate Director of Research and Development, where he worked on pilot plant administration. Later, he served as Director of Research and Development for Central Research Laboratories.

In 1963, he was appointed by Dow to serve on a committee for the formation of an area college, Saginaw Valley College, which today is Saginaw Valley State University.

In 1970, Eldon left Dow Chemical to start Saginaw Valley State University's College of Science, Engineering, and Technology. He worked to build an engineering program from its initial stages of a "thought" to an ABET-accredited engineering school. Since that time he has served the university in many fashions, including professor, Director of Engineering and Technology, and Assistant Dean of the College of Science, Engineering, and Technology. He currently has retired from administrative duties to teach computer-aided engineering.

Eldon Graham joined AIChE in 1952. This year marks his **fiftieth-anniversary of AIChE membership**.

***Winfred Zacharias***

Winfred Zacharias, better known to his peers as Win, worked for The Dow Chemical Company for 34 years after receiving a B. S. ChE from the University of Nebraska and a M. S. from the University of Michigan. At Dow, Win's career expanded from chemical engineering to positions involving finance, where he worked as Assistant Treasurer for cash flow management, partnership financing and auto leasing, and Director of Global Insurance operations.

Following his career at Dow Chemical, Win decided to broaden his experience by launching new enterprises. After founding two reinsurance companies and a private resort, he was one of six individuals to form Omni Tech International, LTD, a consulting firm that provides technical, commercial and organization development for chemical and manufacturing industries. Just this past year, Winfred retired from the board at Omni Tech after 16 years.

Winfred Zacharias joined AIChE in 1952. This year marks his **fiftieth anniversary of AIChE membership**.



**Stan Englund**

Stan Englund joined The Dow Chemical Company in 1951, following the completion of a B.S. ChE from the University of Kansas and an M.S. ChE from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. His career at Dow spanned over forty-years, working in process research and process design, having experience in plastics, inorganics, organics, and specialty chemicals. Among his many accomplishments, he is the editor of the Chemical Process Safety section for the most recent edition of *Perry's Chemical Engineering Handbook*. After retiring from Dow in 1992 as a Process Consultant, he has worked as a consultant on chemical process safety and process design through Omni Tech and his own consulting firm.

Stan Englund joined AIChE in 1952. He served as chair of the Mid-Michigan Section in 1962 and various other officer positions over his long career (Director, committee chair). He is world-renowned in the area of chemical process safety, where he has served on the AIChE national committee on chemical process safety. He is also an AIChE Fellow, which is the highest honor given by our society. This year marks his **fiftieth-anniversary of AIChE membership**.
