Recap of the Cane Land Refinery Tour



Great fun was had by all taking the tour of the Cane Land Distillery. The process uses molasses, raw sugar and clarified juice produced by the Alma Sugar Factory—the parent company—to produce vodka and four different types of rum. The alcohol is produced by fermentation in jacketed stainless-steel tanks for a period of three to four days, typically, then it is distilled from the water in two stills, *Evangeline* and *Sweet Jane*. The vodka comes out of the still at 190-proof (95 volume% alcohol) and then diluted to 80-proof. The rums are distilled to a lower concentration and the final products are 56-80 proof. They are aged in wooden barrels, including the huge cognac barrels shown in the picture.

After the tour those attending got to taste all five types of beverages. So as to be able to drive home they then gathered at Pastime for po-boys and pizza.
