Professional Engineering Certification


The subject of this meeting is an acceptable activity for continuing Professional Development as defined by LAPELS and is approved for one (1) PDH unit.

Recap of the November Dinner Meeting



The Bad News Beer team members, Doug Beach, Donna Bryant, Daniel Candler, and Matt Schutte, gave a description of their beer brewing project and how they placed 2nd Runner Up (3rd over-all place) among 12 teams from around the country at the Annual AIChE Conference in Pittsburgh in October. The competition was strict in the timing of dropping off the beers, setting up the poster, and the presentation time. Teams had to make posters that showed their process in making the beers, the recipes they used, their calculations on the alcohol content and brew house efficiency, and proposed beer labels. While the poster presentation was going on, volunteers to act as the guest judges for the "people choice" award tasted the non-marked beers, and the Beer Judge Certification Program official judges analyzed the beers. The prize considers the taste of the beer as well as the poster.

The team described their process that uses an all-grain brew with sparging during the single mash step in which the wort is filtered off and returned to the mashtun to set the grain bed. To produce their three beers, they used crawfish boiling pots, insulated coolers and three glass fermentation jugs. The beers were a Citrus-y IPA (Indian Pale Ale), a "wheat and wild" hefeweizen, and a big imperial stout. After the presentation those attending were given samples of each of the three beers and they were all impressed by the taste.

Officers for 2019 were elected at the meeting, Chelsea Bourdon for Vice-Chair, Erik Flores for Secretary, Jimmy Orr for Treasurer, and Randy Goodman for Executive Committee.
