Meeting Minutes AIChE Education Division Board Teleconference Thursday, May 8, 2014 1:00 PM Eastern Time

I. Approval of 10/30/13 Board Teleconference and 11/6/13 Business Meeting Minutes (Davis)

Davis sent out the minutes of the 10/30/13 teleconference and the 11/6/13 business meeting. The minutes were approved unanimously. II. Financial Report (Davis)

Our current balance is \$5,932.23 as of January 2014. Last year at this time (January 2013) we had a balance of \$4,666.80. Our 2013 revenue (\$3,510.35) was from dues, banquet payments, and a small amount of interest. Our 2013 expenses were a plaque for the Award for Excellence in Engineering Education Research (\$102.52), an honorarium for that award (\$250.00), a web hosting fee (\$14.99), and the banquet cost (\$1996.41). We anticipate spending more in 2014, assuming we give out three awards rather than just the one from 2013. If anyone has suggestions for the 2014/15 budget, please let Davis know.

IV. Future Faculty Committee Report (Koretsky)

AIChE appears to have changed the way they are doing the reporting.

The report lists 690 current members

(Compare to 189 in October 2013 187 in June 2013, 181 Nov 2012, 169 Nov 2011, but below goal of 250)

- 141 are renewals
- 195 paid (the remainder are invoiced, but not paid)
- 465 are new AIChE members
- 237 international members (student or professional)
- 187 female
- 498 are student members

Of the 195 PAID members:

- 23 are international
- 35 are female
- 5 are students
- 9 are new AIChE members
- 154 academic
- 41 industrial

34 delinquent members (up from 20 in October 2013)

1 paid AIChE dues but not division dues

- X. Committee/Liaison Updates (Bayles)
 - a. Course Survey (Vigeant)

The report on the electives survey will be given at ASEE. The next survey will be on transport courses; the survey is in beta-minus mode right now. Daniel Lepek from Cooper Union is taking the lead on that. The goal is to get the survey out by the end of May.

b. BoK (Silverstein)

There has been no progress on the Body of Knowledge yet. There will be a meeting about it soon.

c. International (Keith)

Nothing new to report.

d. K-12 (Davis)

Davis asked the board's opinion about having an "event chair" for outreach events under our division. Frank Petrocelli has indicated that he would like his activities (currently through SIOC) to be more formally structured under AIChE and it seemed to him like we're a good fit for that. There was some discussion and the board agreed that while we will continue to participate individually in these events, it would be onerous on the division to be structured formally such that we were required to organize these events.

From Frank Petrocelli: "[our current plan is for] the Fuels and Petrochemicals and Environmental Divisions continue to take the lead in planning an outreach event for the Spring Meeting, and YPC, SIOC, and, perhaps, the Education Division do the same for the Annual Meeting. We can then develop 'standard formats' for each meeting's event, reducing the amount of pre-planning required each year." There was an event at the spring meeting but Davis has not heard how it went.

AIChE had a booth at the USA Science and Engineering Festival in Washington, D.C. and that event reportedly went very well.

e. SAChE (Howat)

Howat asked SAChE how the Education Division can assist in their efforts and how SAChE can assist the Education Division. From him:

"The SAChE goal is to provide materials that are useful for learning process safety. SAChE is, in some sense, in a mode of transition from defined topic examples printed in hardcopy to more easily accessible, multi-media eLearning materials available to students, faculty and departments. SAChE, in general, is soliciting feedback on the usefulness of their products to the educational community and on topics the education community would like to have added. The summary points follow:

To Assist SAChE:

- SAChE would like to know whether their products are useful in real classes.
- SAChE would like to know what the Education Division would like to see in terms of products.
- SAChE would like to know whether the product organization, specifically, and the website, generally, are useful.

• SAChE would like some insight and feedback from those using the eLearning products for content, utility and motivation for usage.

To Assist the Education Division

 SAChE would like to know how it can assist the Education Division in preparing for the new ABET requirements."

Davis suggested that SAChE prepare a list of questions or, ideally, a survey for the Education Division membership. Silverstein suggested that we send that survey to the department chairs as well. Howat will follow up with SAChE and see what they say.

f. CAChE (Keith)

CAChE produces a range of educational products with a computational focus. There are several task forces working on additional modules and educational materials. They are always looking for more collaborators, so anyone that is interested should talk with Jason Keith.

g. CAChET (Keith)

CAChET is a website set up for posting faculty positions. Some of the suggestions that have been made in the past by attendees about CAChET are being integrated into the meet the faculty candidate session at AIChE.

h. SCC (Keith)

Nothing new to report.
