November Dinner Meeting

Dinner Speaker: Mr. Michael Turco, General Manager of the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District

Title: The Subsidence Story in the Houston Region

Abstract: Subsidence has been a primary concern in the Houston area for many years. Since 1906, over 10 feet of subsidence has occurred, with a broad area of 6 feet of subsidence existing today throughout most of the Houston Area. In 1975, as a result of area residents and local governments becoming increasingly alarmed by the continued impact of subsidence on economic growth and quality of life in the region, the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District was created by the 64th Texas Legislature as an underground water conservation district with the mission to provide for the regulation of the withdrawal of groundwater to control subsidence.



Over more than forty years of existence, the District has developed substantial data sets providing the foundation for its regulatory plan. The District's regulatory plan allows groundwater users an amount of annual groundwater based on a percentage of an individual permitee's total water demand. The management of the groundwater resources within the District has involved significant coordination with regional ground and surface water suppliers; ongoing interaction with other state and local regulatory bodies; analysis of accurate and up to date predictions on water usage; the enforcement of disincentives to those who rely too heavily on groundwater and a commitment to practicing and promoting water conservation. Areas nearest the Gulf of Mexico coast have completed the conversion to alternative (other than groundwater) water sources, consequently the effective stress on the aquifer has decreased and subsidence rates have been reduced. Areas within the District further inland are currently proceeding through the conversion process, and subsidence has continued in those areas as development of the groundwater resources has continued.

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> Bio: Mr. Turco serves as the General Manager of the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District as well as the Fort Bend Subsidence District (which is administered by the HGSD staff through an inter-local agreement). As General Manager, he is the Chief Administrative Officer responsible for the management of District operations, and for developing goals, strategies and policies necessary to implement the District's legislated mandate. Mr. Turco leads a customer focused team supporting the District's mission of reasonable groundwater regulation to protect lives and property in Harris, Galveston, and Fort Bend Counties from the hazards associated with land subsidence.

> Mr. Turco holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Geology from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and a Master of Science in Geology (Hydrogeology Focus) from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. Mr. Turco participates in the Region H planning group, Groundwater Management Area 14, the Texas Water Conservation Association, the Texas Association of Groundwater Districts, and International Symposia on Land Subsidence

Thomas E. Rehm, PhD, PE, CPSP, CSP, CPSA, CLP

I have had an interesting career; now semi-retired but still busy. It all started in 1972 with UOP – most of my time spent as a Senior Design Engineer. I left there in 1981 to complete graduate studies at Northwestern University, defending my doctoral dissertation in 1985, and joining Amoco Chemical in Naperville, Illinois at the Amoco Research Center, where I was primarily involved in commercializing new products. From there I joined CH&A in 1993, a small consulting firm in Kingwood, Texas, where I investigated industrial accidents, primarily for litigation. Saudi Aramco hired me in 1997 to improve their investigations and in the



process of doing so I became involved on the steering committee that launched Saudi Aramco's version of Process Safety Management in 2005, the year after I led the Saudi Aramco Compliance Review Team, essentially PSM auditing of several Saudi Aramco facilities and operations. Three of the last four groups of letters behind my name are Process Safety Certifications, the fourth being Certified Safety Professional.

I retired in 2009, toured all fifty states with wife Mary in 2010, and settled into semi-retirement in 2011 in the Houston area, near to the greatest concentration of grandkids (6 of 10). As with my career, I have had an interesting retirement – some process safety consulting work now and then and a little volunteer work. I am completing two years as the Human Resources Officer of the South Texas Section. I am a Director of the AIChE Safety & Health Division, a member of the S&H Division Virtual Meeting Planning Committee, the Chair of the S&H Division Student Outreach Committee, a member of the CCPS Process Safety Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, and a member of the AIChE PAIC Climate Task Force. As Chair-Elect of the South Texas Section, I will support our 2018 Chair Carlos Salamanca to achieve successful implementation of all STS programs. Before you cast your vote for me, it is important for you to know that I believe that AGW (anthropogenic global warming) is occurring and I will do everything I can to alter the course of our nation's aversion to this important issue. 
