In 2004 Jim became the Compliance Assistance Specialist (CAS) for OSHA Houston North Area Office which is a nonenforcement position within OSHA responsible for outreach, training, and assistance to employees, employers, and industry groups. Prior to becoming the CAS, Jim was an OSHA inspector and conducted enforcement inspections on hundreds of worksites and investigated numerous workplace fatalities.



2020 State Industrial Energy Program Moves to Houston!

For more than a decade, STS-AIChE has hosted Energy Forums – and more recently also Water Forums – for *Texas Industries of the Future*, a program run through the University of Texas in Austin, and funded by the Texas State Energy Conservation Office (SECO). The collaboration also included the Energy Efficiency Session at the annual AIChE Southwest Process Technology Conference. The forums have added an important dimension to STS's technical program, while supporting efficiency improvements in local industry.



SECO has now moved the funding right here to Houston, and the program has a new name. The new *Texas Industrial Energy Efficiency Program (TIEEP)* is now run through UH Energy at the University of Houston. This creates new opportunities for closer communication with local industry, and ensures a stronger relationship with STS-AIChE, leading to better matching of the program deliverables with the needs of the largest concentration of refineries and chemical plants in Texas.

The forums will continue, although the format may change. You can expect to see some new and dynamic programing as TIEEP builds on earlier successes and provides leadership as we move into the new decade.

The next Energy Forum is scheduled for April 2, 2020, and the theme is "Plant Resiliency - Lessons from Harvey."

He will be facilitating a MOC and PHA discussion. Don's comments and observations will be based on over 65 API Process Safety Site Assessment Program (PSSAP) assessments. The discussion will include how the protocols were developed and how they are scored. Also included will be an over view of the industry performance for the original seven protocols. There will be an in-depth discussion on the industry performance on the MOC and PHA protocols. The MOC and PHA discussion will include specific industry weaknesses and strengths. This is an opportunity to compare your MOC and PHA programs to the industry and gain some insight on how you may be able to improve your programs.

Volunteer Outreach

2020 Science and Engineering Fair of Houston!

Science Fair Volunteers Needed

The final round of the Science and Engineering Fair of Houston (SEFH) will be held in the Brown Convention Center in Downtown Houston on February 14-15, 2020. The STS has participated for many years and a number of our members volunteer yearly, but we always need some new volunteers as well. There are four options for helping out at the SEFH.

- STS will have an informational table on 2:00 7:00 pm, Friday, February 14. We will have an exhibit and talk with students, parents and teachers. We would like to have a volunteer or two in each of the following categories: undergraduate students, graduate students, faculty members, YPs, and (chronologically) mature members. Snacks will be provided.
- In early February we will need volunteers to review abstracts of SEFH exhibits and pick out the chemical engineering exhibits. SEFH will send me the abstracts around February 1. Most chemical engineering exhibits are found in one of six other categories. I can divide the abstracts among several volunteers who can categorize their assigned portion. This will save us a lot of time and inconvenience while judging on February 15.
- STS will be judging exhibits on Saturday afternoon, February 15 as a special awarding agency. Chemical engineering projects are scattered among several science fair categories, so we will need 12 16 judges (6 8 in each age bracket) to find and judge them. If possible, please let us know at least at least a few days in advance if you would like to participate. We invite professional members and graduate students. If your child is competing in SEFH in a ChE-eligible category, you cannot judge in your child's age category. The SEFH provides lunch at 11:30, during which SEFH rules and STS judging organization are discussed. Judging runs from 1:15 4:15, after which our judges meet to pick the winners. Afterwards, some of our judges and volunteers traditionally opt to meet informally for dinner and networking.
- Alternatively, STS members can be "place award" judges for the science fair in chemical engineering and several other categories (chemistry, energy). To do so, you will need to sign up in advance on the SEFH web site, <u>www.SEFHouston.com</u>. Place award judging takes place in morning and afternoon shifts. You cannot be both a place award judge and a special award judge at the same time, though you can be a place award judge in the morning and a special award judge in the afternoon.
- SEFH also needs volunteers in other categories, such as registration, parking, unloading and setup, and display and safety. Undergraduate students are welcome to participate in this category. You need to sign up in advance on the SEFH web site.

All four options provide interesting technical and networking experience. (Several of our members volunteer year after year, though there is ample space for new volunteers.) For options A, B and C, please contact Matt Kolodney (713) 471-8956 or MKolodney1@comcast.net. I can answer some of the questions for categories D and E, but you should also check the SEFH web site.

Further details will be provided soon to volunteers. STS will reimburse participants for up to \$5 of their parking expenses (the total is \$5 to \$10). Lunch is free and provided by SEFH.
