## October 20, 2016 Meeting

For our October meeting, our speaker is a new section member, Mary Ann Curran, an international expert in Life Cycle Assessment. LCA has become widely recognized as an effective tool for assessing the resource use, environmental burdens, and human health impacts connected with the complete life cycle of products, processes, and activities (see her article in CEP October 2015). The use of a holistic view allows decision makers to avoid shifting burdens elsewhere in the system. After retiring from the US EPA in Cincinnati, Ohio, Dr. Curran moved to Rock Hill and works as an independent consultant; she is also Editor-in-Chief of the *International Journal of Life Cycle Assessment* (Springer). Dr. Curran is a Fellow of AIChE. The title of Dr. Curran's presentation is "Life Cycle Assessment: A Systems Approach to Environmental Management."
