



#### **ChE Department Chairs' Regional Meetings/Retreats**

A major, multi-year Fellows' initiative is to create and support recurring Department Chairs' Regional Meetings so that all Department Chairs have a peer group and forum for discussing their collective needs and interests.

The <u>Southeast</u> Region (the Southeast Student Region with several states added), has held a successful, well attended Department Chairs/Heads Meeting for ~50 years. This year's event is being



planned by John Weidner (U. South Carolina) and will be held <u>June 3-5, 2018</u> at the Hilton Clearwater Beach Hotel & Spa. Agendas (2017 & 2018) will be posted on the Fellows Website, when available. Due to the popularity of this event, Weidner indicates limited available space for chairs from outside the Southeast. Fellows Council Member David Rockstraw of (New Mexico State U.) is planning a <u>Southwest-Rocky Mountain</u> Department Chairs Meeting/Retreat for <u>June 8-10, 2018</u> in Sante Fe, NM. The Education Division is cooperating with postings about the Meetings. Fellows Council members, David Rockstraw, John O'Connell, and Dave Eckhardt are involved.

## Gerald A. Lessells Challenge Match for Henry T. Brown Scholarship Endowment



Funding of the Henry T. Brown Endowment for the Education of Under-Represented Minority Chemical Engineers has been given a solid foundation thanks to Gerald A. Lessells — an AIChE Fellow and longtime friend of Brown. To build the endowment, Lessells, who collaborated with Brown on AIChE's earliest minority outreach activities, has made a challenge gift and will match others' donations to the fund up to \$50,000.

AIChE's Minority Affairs Committee (MAC) scholarship program has been named in honor of Brown — a key leader and mentor to

minority chemical engineers over the past 50 years. MAC scholarships have been presented to more than 450 high school and college students. The Brown endowment is mow over \$142K; the goal is \$300,000.

# Summary of Fellows Council Meeting in Minneapolis October 31, 2017 and Telecom January 19, 2018

The AIChE Fellows Council oversees the organized activities of the Fellows and meets at least four times per year to discuss Fellow activities and policies. Two meetings are face-to-face at the fall (Annual) and spring (National) AIChE meetings, and two or more are virtual, usually by teleconference.

At the Minneapolis meeting on October 31, 2017, the main topics were:

- (3) Strategic Initiatives of Sessions at World Congress (slides uploaded to Fellows Website), Cosponsor sessions at 2018 Annual Meeting on "Changes in the Chemical Industry" and Styles of Teaching UG Process Design; potential opportunities in Manufacturing initiatives
- (4) MAC award session and Speed Mentoring workshop
- (5) Sponsored Research: RAPID, DIERS/DIPPR/CCPS progressing well
- (6) PAIC initiatives on climate change, fracking & shale gas, process safety reviews (See aiche.org/paic)
- (7) Admissions Committee developing test cases to facilitate international Fellow nomination and selection
- (8) Professional registration information sessions & evaluating PE prep course in AIChE Academy
- (9) Next telecom in January followed by face-to-face in Orlando, April 24, 2018
