

# Fellow's Agreed to Establish an AIChE Foundation Endowment to be used for the K-12 STEM Ambassador Program

During our April Breakfast and again at our Virtual Fellow's meeting, Raymond Rooks (currently serving in the roles of Catalysis and Reaction Engineering Division (CTOC Liaison), Chemical Engineering Technology Operating Council (Member) and Fellows Council (Member) gave a very inspiring presentation in support of the K-12 STEM Ambassador Program and asked that the Fellowship do all they can to support this effort—both by seeking opportunities to connect with Local Sections and Student Chapters in their area and also to consider making a donation to the AIChE Foundation Fellows Endowment created to help financially support the K-12 STEM Ambassador Program.

Note: As of the February 22nd report 87% of the Fellows Council members have made a donation to the endowment and overall we are approximately at 50% of the 50K goal to be able to start funding the ambassador project.
