Dear ESC, SCC, and AIChE Staff,

As 2017 comes to a close, I want to thank the ESC for a great year. It has been such an honor and a pleasure to work with each and every one of you. I write now to provide a few highlights of the past year and to preview some of the exciting plans we have in store for 2018.

Following our Fall Regional Liaison recruitment, it's evident that the ESC's greatest strength is our diversity. We are a committee of 51 people from 37 AlChE Student Chapters spanning 14 countries. Our diversity stems from our unprecedented International student representation. Last year, less than 4% of ESC members were international students. This year, that number has grown tenfold to almost 40%. International student representation on the ESC is appropriately proportional to the percentage of International AlChE Student Chapters, which is expected to soon surpass 40%. Our committee is comprised of some of the best and brightest student leaders of AlChE. Five ESC members are International Student Chapter Leadership Development Travel Grant recipients. We have ESC members from ten 2017 Outstanding Student Chapter award winning schools. Finally, we have countless past presidents, presidents, and officers that provide the AlChE student leadership experience that Chapters worldwide benefit from. I am incredibly grateful to be a part of such a diverse and strong team.

2018 marks the 10 year anniversary of the founding of the Executive Student Committee. 10 years later our mission has not changed. We still strive to help improve Student Chapters and to connect Chapters with each other to form an AIChE Student community. New to 2017 however, the ESC introduced exciting new initiatives to help accomplish our mission. The ESC launched the ESC Officer Central, a collection of helpful resources on the ESC website for Student Chapter leaders. The ESC Officer Central will be updated monthly, evolving to address the changing issues that Student Chapters face. Additionally, the ESC reestablished the ESC Monthly Newsletters, an online newsletter sent to Student Chapter leaders around the world. These newsletters will help keep Student Chapters informed and connected with each other. Finally, the ESC has helped 23 Student Chapters connect with each other through the Sister Chapter Program, as well as keep the 38 current Sister Chapters engaged in the Program.

In 2018 we continue to face the challenge of connecting Student Chapters across regions and borders. We will shortly be introducing the "Show-and-Tell Challenge", a video challenge that will allow Student Chapters to feature an interesting and unique aspect of their Chapter, their school, or their state or country's culture. This challenge was proposed to help showcase AIChE Student Chapters and connect Chapters through social media. We are also looking to work with the Young Professionals Committee (YPC) and I'm excited to see what comes from our relationship.

Our many accomplishments would not be possible without the support from Sarah Ewing and Emily Miksiewicz. I also want to thank the Student Chapters Committee (SCC) for their continued support of the ESC.

Thank you all for a great year. I'm excited to see what we can accomplish together in 2018.
