

#### **EASY TO GET AROUND**

- Compact walkable city with short distances
- Efficient public transportation system
- Copenhagen Airport is located 8 km from the city centre - less than 15 minutes travel time by metro or train and 15-20 minutes by taxi
- The <u>Copenhagen Metro</u> (M1-M4) covers all of Copenhagen with a high frequency 24/7
- In 2019, the M3 'Circle Line' opened with 17 new stations in the city centre and in 2020, the M4 opened connecting the rest of the city with two new stations
- By 2024, the M4 will be expanded with five additional new stations
- Getting around in Copenhagen is also inexpensive, especially if you choose to make use of its compact, walkable size
- The <u>Copenhagen Card</u>, provides unlimited public transportation and free admission to over 85 attractions and sights



#### **SOCIAL VENUES**

- Copenhagen offers a broad range of social venues from historical buildings to modern design gems and unique music venues
- Copenhagen's restaurants are riding the green-wave and the New Nordic kitchen focuses on seasonal ingredients and a largely organic use of produce
