David & Karen Eckhardt Make \$100K Gift to AlChE Foundation

The Foundation of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) has received a gift to fund annual conferences for chemical engineering undergraduates in the northeastern U.S.

David R. Eckhardt and his wife, Karen, along with the Pfizer Foundation Matching Gifts Program, are donating more than \$100,000 to create the Northeast Student Regional Conference Endowment Fund. This generous gift will ensure financial support to sustain and expand one of AIChE's most robust student activities.

The Northeast Regional Conference is one of nine annual AlChE regional student meetings. The conferences provide scholarly and professional development opportunities for chemical engineering students, and includes research paper and poster competitions, as well as annual Chem-E-Car™ Competitions.

Peter Lederman, Chair of the AICE Foundation, lauded Eckhardt's gift saying, "Dave and Karen's philanthropic leadership sets an example for others to follow, and is a worthwhile investment in the future of the chemical engineering profession."

More than 300 undergraduate chemical engineers attend each year's Northeast Conference, representing AIChE student chapters and members at the following schools: Brown, Clarkson, Cornell, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, McGill, Northeastern, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Rochester Institute of Technology, Syracuse, Tufts, Université Laval, University of Connecticut, University of Maine, University of Massachusetts-Amherst, University of Massachusetts-Lowell, University of New Brunswick, University of New Hampshire, University of New Haven, University of Rhode Island, University of Rochester, Worcester Polytechnic

Institute, and Yale.

AIChE: What are you working on that may most positively impact society or the future?


JT: We're helping smaller companies in the chemical and material sector grow, get more competitive, and use technology and better business practices to advance their goals.

2013 Gala: Ethics in Engineering Projects

AIChE's 2013 Gala in November celebrated "Recognizing Excellence in Engineering Ethics." Funds raised from the gala are being used to continue the expansion of ethics training, both through undergraduate education and through life-long learning for chemical engineering undergraduates and the profession.

Here are some examples of how the funds were spent.

Ethics in Engineering Short Film: As part of building awareness for the importance of
Ethics in undergraduate education and the profession, funds from the generous support of
gala sponsors have been used to promote AIChE's own code of ethics through a short film
which features ChemE Students and AIChE members on Ethics and Chemical Engineering.
AIChE's Code of Ethics states that our members "hold paramount the safety, health and

welfare of the public and protect the environment in the performance of their professional duties." By building awareness of AIChE's own code of ethics we are addressing what future chemical engineering leaders know about the importance of ethics in the profession.

- eLearning Courses Ethics of Sustainability & Ethics for Chemical Engineers: to
 create courseware in the ethics of various aspects of the profession and a standalone
 eLearning course that will qualify for the credit needed to renew PE licenses. Members and
 other customers will gain important knowledge, be able to earn a credential, and/or qualify for
 renewal of their PE licenses.
- SAChE Ethics Modules Process Safety: In order to allow electronic access to SAChE
 Safety Modules for all students of chemical engineering each year, a Learning Management
 System was procured. The system allows for collaboration between students and professors
 in a community environment as well as private discussions and questions to experts. There
 are 9 modules in total.

Developing a culture of Process Safety is paramount to the AIChE mission of promoting excellence in ethics in Chemical Engineering. Preventing accidents, teaching best practices and engendering a safety culture is critical to the image of the profession and is quite importantly, simply the right thing to do and enhances our standards for this Industry.

2014 AIChE Annual Fund Project Funding

Donations made to the Annual Fund enable the AIChE Foundation to support key programs and

Each year the Foundation invites our Operating Councils and Board Committees to submit proposals for funding that have the greatest impact on the Institute's members and our profession. Since 2008, the Annual Fund has supported:

- · Programs that magnify AIChE's global reach and effectiveness
- Educational initiatives that enhance undergraduate curricula and lifelong learning
- Engagement of young professionals who will become the next generation of leaders in our field
- Awareness and information on critical issues pertaining to energy, water and sustainability
- Products and services using the latest web technologies for today's on-the-go chemical engineers

We are pleased to announce the following programs that have been approved for funding in 2014 and look forward to their impact and success:

- International Student Chapter Leadership Development Travel Grant
 The International Student Chapter Leadership Development Travel Grant will be awarded on
 the basis of leadership involvement in student chapter activities, academic achievement, and
 financial need. Currently only 6% of the student participation each year is international. To
 facilitate the participation and leadership development of the international student leadership
 at the conference, representative of all the international regions, funding is necessary to
 cover international travel expenses. Recipients will also be asked to submit a postconference article for publication in the Student newsletter. Read about International Student

- Encouraging Global Engagement in the Global Home for Chemical Engineers
 Encouraging faculty and industrial partners to provide opportunities and encourage students
 to participate in international projects will serve to develop professionals who can see the
 opportunities in global challenges and advance the profession. The initiative aims to
 familiarize students with the benefits of international projects to their professional and
 personal development as well as a means of global community service. It also aims to
 encourage engagement and collaboration between AIChE and Engineers without Borders
 (EWB) student chapters (amongst others). Read about AIChE student chapters.
- Minority Affairs Committee (MAC) Scholarship Program
 With the help of member support and the AIChE Foundation, MAC has granted scholarships to more than 300 under-represented minority engineering students since the programs inception in 1994. The MAC scholarship program has provided \$1,000 per recipient to incoming college freshmen and current college student scholars, and has also worked to build a mentorship dimension for the scholarship recipients. This program has provided scholarships based on merit and need. MAC will add two additional scholarships set aside for returning MAC scholars who are making reasonable progress towards a bachelor's degree. The goal is to help build the connection with AIChE and help keep track of scholars through their undergraduate career.
