### **AIChE 2013 Gala *Engineering Ethics***

This year's AIChE Gala will take place on November 21, 2013, at The Plaza Hotel in New York City as we recognize three chief executive officers for their role in "Excellence in Engineering Ethics." Leaders from AIChE and from companies worldwide in the chemical process and related industries will attend the Gala. Funds raised will be used to underwrite the continued expansion of ethics awareness and training in chemical engineering undergraduate education and life-long learning for professionals.

Honorees are chosen each year and recognized at the Gala for their contributions to the field. This year, the honorees include David M. Cote, Chairman and CEO of Honeywell; David T. Seaton, Chairman and CEO of Fluor; and Stephen F. Angel, Chairman, President, and CEO of Praxair. These corporate leaders will be recognized for exemplifying a personal commitment to ethics in their companies and business practices.

## Endowment and Bequest Policy

### *Building for the Future*

To accommodate the wishes of donors who want to see their long-term financial support of AIChE used for specific projects and philanthropic endeavors, the Institute's Board of Directors has approved a new AIChE Foundation policy pertaining to endowments and bequests. The policy formalizes several categories of support under the endowment designation — one of several types of contributions that AIChE welcomes from benefactors.

This new policy gives donors the opportunity to carefully choose the program or area they wish to support. Endowment donations will be placed into one of two categories: permanently restricted funds (PRF) and permanently restricted donor designated funds (PRDDF).

PRF donations of \$2,000 or more will be reserved for long-term use, and PRDDF donations of \$50,000 or more can be dedicated more specifically to a program of the donor's choice. Specifically, the PRDDF category is key for donors who wish to specify a particular area or program where their gifts will be used.

Gift to AIChE's Endowment make a significant impact because they offer financial stability and ensure long-term funding to support and maintain critical programs and initiatives.

## AICHE Leadership Challenge

### *Developing Tomorrow's Leaders*

The AIChE Foundation's Leadership Challenge: Volunteer Leaders for the Future program is a unique opportunity for young professionals, offering three years of subsidized AIChE membership dues in return for volunteer work and leadership involvement. The program currently sponsors over 60 young professionals (apprentices), and hopes to reach 75 participants by the end of this year.

The apprentices are currently involved in leadership activities which include managing local projects on k-12 outreach and public awareness initiatives, providing content for AIChE's blog, ChEnected, attending/presenting at national conferences, and serving in leadership roles on the AIChE Young Professionals Committee.

To date, the program has raised over \$90,000 from 40 generous donors. Donations to the Leadership Challenge program give young professionals a rare and invaluable opportunity to become deeply involved in their profession and society. Various apprentices reflected on how the program has already made an impact on their career development and engagement in AIChE.
