## 1. DIERS 2020 August 2020 Virtual Meeting

The DIERS August 2020 Virtual Meeting was a success. Comments from attendees were favorable with several suggestions for improvements. Action is being taken to make the next meeting even better. Attendance was 77 and the most since the early days of DIERS. There were 26 technical presentations. Minutes of the meeting to include all of the presentations will shortly be posted to the DIERS website.

#### 2. DIERS 2021March Virtual Meeting

The DIERS 2021 March Virtual Meeting will use the Microsoft TEAMS (free software) to conduct a three day (March 10 (Wed) - 12 (Fri), 2021) meeting to cover what you need to know to size emergency pressure relief devices for runaway chemical reactions and two-phase vapor-liquid flows. The meeting will be held over a three day period meeting at a cost of \$99.00 per day for one, two, or all three days. A Call for Presentations has been issued. An agenda for the meeting will be published and posted on or about January 15, 2021. Professional Development Credits for attendance at DIERS meetings are available upon request. Attendance at this and future DIERS meetings is limited to those who have paid their DIERS calendar year dues before or at the time of registration for the DIERS meeting.

## 4. CCPS Guidelines Book

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition (April 2017) of the "Guidelines for Pressure Relief and Effluent Handling Systems" has been published by CCPS, AIChE, and DIERS. Software having estimated development costs of approximately \$3MM is included with the book to include the legacy CCFLOW and TPHEM programs and well as the new SuperChems for DIERS Lite program, which contains a large physical property data base. The software will can be used for vapor, liquid or two-phase flows and can be downloaded for use with WINDOWS XP, 7, 8, 8.1 and 10 operating systems configured as 32 or 64 bit systems.

## 5. SuperChems for DIERS

SuperChems<sup>TM</sup> for DIERS is an advanced digital simulation software tool used for pressure relief design and provided by ioMosaic Corporation to AIChE for license to individuals and corporations. The software is available for a onetime license acquisition fee of \$12,500 to include up to five users and an annual maintenance fee of \$2,000. New technology updates are provided on a periodic basis. Training is available. Contact the DIERS Chair for information on the program and how to license the software.

A company attending an AIChE Loss Preventions meeting admitted that they did not necessarily have the staff or expertise to size emergency pressure relief systems for runaway reactions and / or two-phase vapor-liquid flow.
