Since this is a Local Section team competition, it's open to all current dues year AIChE professional members who are 21 and older and members of an AIChE Local Section (including the Virtual Local Section).

Any number from two to five Local Section members can make up a team, provided that at least one team member is a Young Professional (under age 35). Local Sections can register multiple teams, and a person may be on multiple teams.

The ABBC is a great way to keep Young Professionals engaged in their Local Section. It's a new, fun and innovative way for YPs, or any member, to showcase their knowledge and allows for creativity as well as some friendly competition among peers.

Mid-Michigan Brewing Competition

Mid-Michigan Section of (MMAIChE), in collaboration with American Chemical Society (ACS), organized a Homebrew Beer Tasting and Competition during summer-fall of 2014. This was the first time such a competition was organized by MMAIChE. The purpose of the event was to provide an opportunity for professionals to network, particularly the ones who have an interest in beer making. The spirit of the event was to provide a casual medium to interact through an activity that they are interested in or want to develop an interest for through a friendly competition.

The competition started off with a kick-off social event on July 19, 2014 at WhichCraft Taproom in Midland, MI. The event featured expert tips and presentations from Tri-City Brewing and Oracle Brewing. The organizing team (Anshul Agarwal, Michael Vagnini, John McKeen, Kristen Gooshaw, and Kyle Andrews) provided overview of various initiatives and events organized by MMAIChE and ACS. The event also featured local homebrewing vendors who provided special discounts for the competition.

The timeline of the competition involved sign-up by August 1, beer registration by September 27, and final beer bottle drop-off at WhichCraft by October 17. The participants were allowed to submit multiple beer entries. were 95 entries from fifty participants, and they included nearly every major style category of beer. On October 18 a team of fourteen judges, including brewers from Tri-City Brewing and O'Sullivan Distributing, judged beers based on various categories from BJCP guidelines such as aroma, appearance, flavor, and mouthfeel. Scores for each entry were averaged, and the top eight brews proceeded to a final round of judging, where they were ranked by four tasters.

The Homebrew Beer Tasting Event was held on October 25 at WhichCraft Taproom, graciously hosted by taproom owners. Due to the high level of participation and the capacity of the host facility, the event was open only to the competition participants







and one guest of each brewer, co-brewer, event and tasting volunteer. people Approximately 100 were including volunteers attendance, who poured samples of all the homebrew. Welcomes were given by representatives from MMAIChE and ACS. WhichCraft was abuzz for three hours as beer enthusiasts tasted each other's creations and talked about everything from flavor profiles to water chemistry. Some guests developed their own rating system to compare their own winners to the official ones to be announced that day. Throughout the afternoon, brewers and beer tasters were commenting that it was about time that an event like this was held in the area, as it brought together a large part of the local homebrew community for the first time.

Suspense built until the winners were announced near the end of the tasting event. There were style category awards for best stout, India pale ale, American ale, and French/Belgian ale. The winners received a prize package from a local beercentric establishment. There were four first-time homebrewers who received special recognition. At the close of the event, brewers were talking about future such competitions and had plenty of ideas to offer. The event was certainly a roaring success and set a strong precedent for local MMAIChE-sponsored events in the future. MMAIChE is now enthused about participating in AIChE's Institute-wide brewing competition.
